Nightly Reading at Home

One of the most important habits to establish with your child is reading at home on a consistent basis. This can be reading with a parent, reading to a sibling, or reading independently. The evidence that supports a direct link between reading at home and success in school is overwhelming. Any help to establish a positive reading routine with your child would be greatly appreciated. As a general guideline 4/5 grade students should be reading a minimum of 20-25 minutes a night (Monday-Thursday) while a K/1 student should be reading 10-15 minutes a night. I know our students and

families are busy throughout the week, so while nightly reading is the goal, trying to reach our weekly targets by reading more on some nights and less on hectic nights is a great plan. Some classes may be using a weekly reading note while others may be using a monthly calendar. Regardless of how you track the reading, please help us by carving time out of your child's busy schedule to prioritize reading either independently or with a family member. Establishing this routine of both reading to and with our students and talking to our students about what they read is a great way to encourage their love of reading, strengthen your connection with them, and put them on a path of success.

K/1: 40-60 minutes a week

2/3: 60-80 minutes a week

4/5: 80-100 minutes a week
