Dear Parents,

The new guidelines for quarantining sent out by Greater Clark County Schools have generated a great deal of questions about how that impacts students at Utica Elementary. Our school is working hard to implement these guidelines wherever possible to ensure the safety of all of our students.

Here are some answers to a few of the most commonly asked questions:

1. How has contact tracing changed?

Beginning August 9, masks were required at school, and by August 11, our teachers had modified the physical space in the classrooms to reduce groupings and minimize movement. We also re-implemented many of the procedures that were in place last year that were found effective to reduce the spread of COVID. Due to these changes, we are able to better track who has been exposed to a COVID positive person. When masks are worn, we should quarantine anyone within 3 feet of the person for 15 minutes or more. When masks are not worn, ex. Cafeteria, we should quarantine anyone within 6 feet of the person for 15 minutes or more. These new procedures have already reduced the spread of COVID in our building and the number of students that need to be quarantined. We contact trace on the bus, cafeteria, school sponsored sports, classrooms, and special areas.

2. What happens if my child is a close contact under the new guidelines?

When we are notified that a person has tested positive, we contact trace for every day they could have transmitted the virus to others in our school. We create a list of students in close proximity on what days. This gives us the 14 day quarantine, reduced 10 day quarantine, the window for testing, and a 7 day quarantine. We call every family that has a student that needs to be quarantined. We also recently implemented a new practice of generating a letter with key dates of return to hand over when the student is picked up. This was implemented per parent suggestions. We no longer send a message out to all families, instead starting this Friday, there will be a public dashboard where everyone can check to see how many students are quarantined and how many have tested positive. I do not think this dashboard will include students that are quarantined by the family due to outside exposure.

3. Why are students allowed to return to school on day 11?

The CDC changed quarantine guidelines in fall of 2020 stating that a person could stop quarantining on day 11 if they wore a mask full time and kept their distance. They also said it was reasonable to return to work on day 8 if a COVID test administered on day 5 or later came back negative. It is my understanding that the CDC made that modification because there was evidence that symptoms usually developed by day 5 (I am not medical so, please do your own research on this). Staff in Greater Clark have been allowed to return to work at the earlier dates both last year and this year. Recently our local health department and Greater Clark Schools made the determination that students should also be allowed to return at the earlier date.

4. What are the enhanced measures taken upon their return?

Our school's challenge is how to enhance safety and distance on day 11, 12, 13, and 14 when a parent chooses to send their child back early. We must work within the limits of space and staffing. We will do our best to keep early return students three to six feet from others. We do require early returning students to wear masks the entire day, inside and outside. We space the early return students as far from others as possible. During lunch, when masks are not worn, we are using our gym to space early return students 6 feet apart from each other. We cannot change bussing but would prefer early returning students to be car riders on day 11, 12, 13, and 14 if possible. These guidelines also apply to students that return to school on day 8 with a negative test through day 14. We are continuing to look at our daily routines and determine if there are additional ways to ensure all are safe. If you are not comfortable with your child coming back to school early, we respect that completely. They do not have to return until day 15. We have had a few students return early and struggled with the enhanced procedures. I understand completely and would encourage you to reach out to us in this case.

These are challenging times and our entire staff appreciates your patience and kindness. We care about your child and want to make sure we do everything possible to make Utica Elementary a healthy and safe learning environment. Thank you for trusting us with your children.


